Issue: Monitoring Date: 8-28-08

Background:

• APHIS engages in monitoring and surveillance through blood serum sampling of cattle at livestock markets, beef processing plants, and area herds. The majority of sampling is based on a backtag system which traces animals back to state of origin.

• The Agency engages in birthsite monitoring in those years that there is significant parturition happening in Zone 2.

Current Status:

- Herd plans for cattle in Zone 2:
 - Two remaining herds in Zone 2:
 - Annual brucellosis vaccinating of replacement heifers.
 - Annual testing of cattle
 - Adult vaccination offered for adults (vaccinate at 2 year interval)
 - Necropsy of abortions
 - Herds within 2 miles of Zone 2
 - Tested after events of significant exposure
 - Adult vaccination offered with testing
- Ongoing surveillance of adult cattle for brucellosis through market cattle identification (processing plant) testing, livestock market testing, export, and other testing by private practitioners.
- Birthsite monitoring of bison in Zone 2, where birthsites are found through telemetry of seronegative pregnant animals, or through following bison movements/hazing to find newborns/birthsites. Sample and GPS site; culture for B. abortus.
