1 Dec 2011**

Situation

- ~2,300 northern herd; 1,400 central herd
 - Largest number of bison in northern herd
- **■** Forecast : Above-average winter
- Developed population and migration models
- Predicted migration: >800 north; 500 west



Management Plan

- Manage abundance and composition
 - End winter with ~3,000 bison
 - Equal sex ratio and herd numbers
- Hunting/selective culls of infectious bison
 - Remove ~330 bison (not counting winter-kill)
 - Focus on females in northern herd (~200)



Revised 2009 Operations Plan

- Outlines actions to implement IBMP
- Proposes desired population conditions based on IBMP and NPS mission
- Incorporates 2005-2011 adaptive adjustments

Operations Plan – Sections

- Organization and responsibilities
- Monitoring and management activities
- Hunting (Public and Treaty)
- Hazing and capturing bison
- Disease suppression
- Lethal removal
- Transfer of surplus bison
- Vaccination of bison and cattle
- Safety (Agency staff and public)

Issues

- No consensus on Plans/Adjustments
 - e.g., population levels; agency contributions
 - Can't agree to changes in timely manner
- **Tolerance outside park? uncertainties**
 - Litigation
 - Require a change in hazing practices
 - Reasonable numbers and distribution
- Hunting tool for reducing abundance
 - Hunting not authorized in Yellowstone
 - Locations; Timing; Age/sex classes
 - Does little to **APPROPOSED but not yet approved prevalence

Issues

- Slaughter tool for suppressing disease
 - Governor may prohibit the importation of bison into Montana
 - Transport bison to Tribes for slaughter?
- Quarantine not a long-term solution for reducing abundance
 - Quickly reach saturation of disease-free bison
 - Trouble placing disease-free bison on public lands in Montana or elsewhere
- Stephens Creek holding bison
- Not talking about is sugar-distrust/litigation

Winter 2012

- Consider Citizen's Working Group recommendations
- Implement 2011 tolerance agreement with 150-200 bison north of park
 - Increased hunting; Learn to live with bison
 - Will likely need to hold bison (Stephens Crk)
- Implement selective culling of infectious bison and vaccination of females during February (after most hunting)
- Transfer bison to Tribes and research
- Respond to unitable actions/litigation
